Category I: Non-Paper Recyclables

(collected during weeks indicated in RED)

METAL • PLASTIC • GLASS



ACCEPTABLE:

- Metal food & beverage cans
- Glass food & beverage containers
- Plastic bottles, jars, jugs, & tubs

EXCLUDED:

- NO plastic bags or styrofoam of any kind
- NO plastic wrap, films, or tarps
- NO plastic utensils
- NO plastic cup lids or straws
- NO colored plastic cups
- NO plastic toys, flower pots, or hangers
- NO ceramics, pots, pans, or baking glass
- NO light bulbs or plate glass

Category II: Paper Recyclables

(collected during weeks indicated in BLACK)

PAPER & CARDBOARD



ACCEPTABLE:

- Newspaper, magazines, office paper
- Note pads
- Paperback Books
- Corrugated cardboard (flattened & stacked, not to exceed 2' x 2' x 2')
- Boxboard (ie: cereal boxes, no lining)
- Junk mail (plastic window okay)

EXCLUDED:

- NO plastic coated papers
- NO paper plates, cups, or napkins
- NO carbon paper
- NO wrapping paper, foil paper, or tissue

*Bins used for recyclables may not exceed 35 gallons in capacity or 50 lbs in weight, and should be clearly marked for recycling.



Curbside Trash Collection

POLICIES & PROCEDURES

- Although Pinard Waste Systems will typically make collections at approximately the same time each week, occasionally circumstances occur causing us to alter our schedule, resulting in earlier collections. In order to avoid missing your collection, **materials must be placed at curbside by 6:30 am** on your scheduled collection day. The appropriate week's recyclables should also be placed curbside at this time, in a separate container from household trash, and clearly marked for recycling.
- Maximum size per container: 35 gallons- Larger containers may be utilized provided the contents are bagged within the receptacle.
- Maximum weight per container: 50 pounds
- Maximum number of containers: Each household is allowed up to 120 gallons of material per week. Customers exceeding this limit will be charged an additional fee of \$1.00 for 13-gallon bags or barrels and \$2.50 for 32-gallon bags or barrels.

MATERIALS REQUIRING SPECIAL HANDLING

- Special arrangements and surcharges are required for any materials that require special handling, which are not included with the weekly collection. These items include:
 - tires
 - bulky / heavy items of any type
 - liquid waste of any type
 - construction / demolition materials
 - hazardous / toxic substances
 - ashes
 - electronics (tv's, stereos, monitors, etc.)
 - fluorescent light bulbs
- ** **Sharp objects** (needles, razor blades, broken glass, etc.): Pinard Waste Systems will collect these items along with your scheduled collection. However, per New Hampshire rule, they must be placed in a rigid, puncture-resistant, sealed container, such as a laundry detergent bottle, and placed in with the regular trash, not the recycling.**
- NH RSA 149-M:15 and 16 mandate that leaf and yard waste must be composted and may not be disposed of in the waste stream. In order to comply with this statute, the following items must also be handled separately, and therefore also require special arrangements and surcharges:
 - leaves
 - lawn rakings
 - brush

HOLIDAYS

- Pinard Waste Systems strives to minimize the inconvenience to our customers caused by collection delays. Therefore, you can expect us to be operating on schedule on most holidays. The following holidays are the only exceptions:
 - New Year's Day
 - 4th of July
 - Thanksgiving
 - Memorial Day
 - Labor Day
 - Christmas Day
- Observed holidays impact collection in the following manner:
Within the holiday week, collection will occur on schedule on the days preceding the holiday. Collections scheduled for the holiday, as well as the remainder of the week will be delayed one day. **For example, Thanksgiving falls on a Thursday. Customers with scheduled collections Monday through Wednesday of that week will not be affected. Thursday's collections will occur on Friday, and Friday's collections will occur on Saturday.**
